

Clearwater Public Library continues to offer resources for everyone

Although there have once again been a few changes over the past year, the *Clearwater Public Library* continues to offer resources for everyone in the community.

"This year the changes have all been about convenience," said Librarian Shelly Kuelbs.

One of the biggest changes is the curbside pick-up service for patrons. Last spring Clearwater was selected as one of five libraries in the *Great River Regional Library* system to implement the pilot system, which has since grown to all 32 branches. Patrons can either make an appointment or call once they arrive at the building.

"Our greatest challenge this year has been finding ways to continue offering services the Clearwater community relied on," said Kuelbs. "We started with curbside pick-up and the response from patrons was heartwarming. Their enthusiasm for being able to once again check out a book really gave us the boost we needed to keep working through the challenges."

The library has also added Print2GO. Patrons can send their print jobs directly to the library for printing from their own devices, even from home. Patrons just stop by the library to pay for and pick up the prints.

As a branch of *Great River Regional Library* (GRRL), the *Clearwater Public Library* is able to offer patrons access to any of the one million books, CDs and DVDs available in the system using their library card, which is free to apply for.

Along with traditional materials, GRRL also offers a digital library of ebooks, and eaudiobooks, which are free to download. Patrons can apply for an e-card online, which gives them access to all digital material. Patrons now have access to Hoopla as well, with Hoopla book and video access on demand, no waiting.

Another service offered is access to several research databases, including LinkedIn Learning, Pronunciator, genealogy, and teacher and student references.

The library has public internet stations available for patrons, as well as wireless access for laptop computers, and a convenient self-checkout station. New this year is internet hotspots, which can be checked out from the library for one week with unlimited data.

Regular programming for all ages is still limited, so during this time take and make kits for youth are being offered as often as possible. There are also several virtual programs being offered for all ages through the GRRL system. Both summer and winter reading programs are available in person or using the Beanstack app, and the Try It Yourself kits have become very popular.

"I'm thankful for the understanding of our patrons during this time of COVID," said Library Assistant Tera Fogal. "The kindness and respect shown to staff and fellow patrons has shown how the Clearwater Library is an oasis of education, information, and normalcy in our ever-changing world."

The Friends of the *Clearwater Area Library* is a volunteer group that meets to discuss needs of the library as well as fundraisers to help pay for those needs. The group holds book sales and runs Second Chapter used bookstore, which is located at the rear of the library. The proceeds of all fundraisers are used to help fund library programs.

"The Clearwater Area Friends of the Library is a small group of patrons that love our library and value its existence in the community," said President Mary Torgersen. "Since the library first

opened the Friends have enhanced the programs, services, and facilities that help to make our library so welcoming."

Kuelbs, Fogal, and other staff members are always available to answer questions in person or by phone whenever the library is open.

Parks/Recreation

Clear Lake:

The Chet Goenner Pavilion

The Chet Goenner Pavilion is located in the main city park behind the fire station building. It is a beautiful facility with a large kitchen and serving area as well as many picnic tables for lots of seating. There are indoor bathrooms and the main area of the pavilion is finished in knotty pine wood and has been recently remodeled. There are two extended covered areas with seating on each side of the pavilion as well as gorgeous landscaping in the front and side areas.

Flowers and shrubs are in full bloom for the whole summer rental season. Cost for rental of the pavilion facility is \$125 per full day, which includes the use of the full kitchen. There is a wonderfully equipped playground immediately in front of the pavilion which makes it a truly desirable location for family gatherings and special event parties. There is a large paved parking area in the front of the building as well. Please contact the city clerk at 320-743-3111 for information and booking dates.

Hunter Lake Bluffs Development Park

Located near the intersections of Hunter Lake Drive and Natures Edge Road. The park offers a small picnic shelter, basketball hoop and playground equipment.

Clear Lake Township Park

Clear Lake Township Park is located south off Cty. Road. 8 (River Road SE) on 8th Ave. The park offers walking trails, restroom facilities, rest area and off-leash dog park (dogs must be leashed when entering park area). Smoking and alcohol is prohibited. Visit: www.clearlaketownship.org.park

Clearwater:

Eldorado Park

Located on 880 Kelsey Ave NW. The park has new playground equipment, soccer field and lots of open space for other activities.

Lions Park

The Lions Park & Pavilion is located at 1100 Cty. Road 75 in Clearwater. There is a tennis court, ice skating rink (winter only),

playground equipment, and a basketball court. There is a pavilion to rent for special events. Please call City Hall at 320-558-2428 for scheduling.

Riverside Park

Riverside Park is located at the intersection of Main St. and Cty. Road 75 at 11 Main Street. It houses the old Mill Pond, which is reputed to be a pretty fair fishing site.

Riverside Park also offers shaded picnic sites, playground equipment and lots of open space.

Sportsman's Park/Ballfield

The Sportsman's Park is located south of Cty. Road 75 on Cty. Road 143, 20802 27th Ave. E. The park has a designer 18-hole disc golf course, children's play set, and baseball fields.

There is a pavilion to rent for special events. Please call City Hall at 320-558-2428 for scheduling.

Spring Street Park

Spring Street Park is located in Clearwater's historic downtown area at the corner of Spring & Oak St. at 310 Spring St.

The park features a new play set, a half-court basketball area, a picnic table and lighting.

River County Bike Trail

In the City of Clearwater, this trail connects three of the city parks: Sportsman's, Riverside and the Lions Park. It provides pedestrians and bicyclists a safe route through the city.

The trail is open all year.

Archery Park

Clearwater's newest recreational addition is the Archery Park located in the Wayside Rest on Cty. Road. 75 just northwest of Hwy. 24. And for easy access from one park to another, four of the city's six parks are connected and accessible by a paved walking/biking trail, which was completed in 2015. The trail will someday be part of a bigger regional trail, connecting with Monticello to the east and St. Cloud to the west.

Clearview Elementary continues tradition of excellence during challenging year

Clearview Elementary School continued its tradition of excellence this year while transitioning to multiple learning models during COVID. Whether in hybrid, distance learning or in-person classrooms, faculty, staff, students, and families rose to the occasion.

"All teachers and staff went above and beyond to meet the needs of students and families," said Principal Meredith Boucher. "And always with a positive attitude."

Clearview Elementary is a PreK-Grade 5 school that offers families two outstanding educational choices: a traditional English classroom or a Spanish Immersion classroom.

The Spanish Immersion program introduces the Spanish language to students in kindergarten and continues to immerse them in Spanish throughout second grade. Beginning in third grade, students are introduced to English during Language Arts for 30 minutes a day.

Due to COVID challenges this year, Amity interns, who normally help staff the immersion program, were not on site. Amity interns come from foreign countries to spend the school year with students who are learning to speak their native language and are similar to student teachers in that they both assist and learn how to be teachers themselves. Clearview is hopeful that they will be able to welcome back Amity for the 21-22 school year.

Another unique program at Clearview is the continuing partnership with the DNR and community volunteers to restore the 42-acre



Clearview Forest, including restoring a natural prairie site, cleaning out dead and diseased trees, and removing invasive species. Students benefit from this exciting outdoor "classroom."

"We are very proud of our school community," said Principal Boucher. "We worked hard all year to create consistent learning for kids regardless of learning model. We look forward to welcoming students back in September!"

A part of *St. Cloud Area School District 742*, Clearview is a top-ranked elementary school located on State Hwy. 24 between Clearwater and Clear Lake.

Visitors who come to *Lake Maria State Park* will enjoy one of the few remaining stands of the "Big Woods," a maple, oak and basswood forest that once covered part of southern Minnesota.

Backpack sites, located on remote lakes and ponds throughout the park, are just two miles from the trailhead parking lot. New log camper cabins, located near lakes and ponds, provide bunk beds for six people and a table and benches for campers who want more of the creature comforts.

Lake Maria State Park is home to the Blandings turtle, easily identified by bright yellow spots on its shell. It is one of Minnesota's threatened species.

Clear Waters Outfitting gets people out on the water

There are a lot of things that make the Clearwater and Clear Lake area unique. One of them is the Mississippi River that cuts between the two communities, which was just what Dan and Sandra Meer were looking for when searching out a location for their new business, *Clear Waters Outfitting*.

"We were looking for a place to do outfitting and get people out on the water," said Sandra Meer. "We found this, bought the building, and built a second one. It's a very unique location and gives us access to the river."

The section of the Mississippi River *Clear Waters Outfitting* is located on has been designated as one of Minnesota's "Wild & Scenic" river locations by the DNR (St. Cloud to Anoka section). The designation is due to the miles of river that are still in their natural state due to management planning and zoning ordinances.

The river along this stretch has a gentle current and shallow, rocky bottom, making it ideal for canoes, kayaks, and stand up paddle boarding. The flow and river structure makes it ideal for a variety of fish, and in fact, the stretch is considered world class smallmouth bass fishing.

"We're bringing paddling to the community," said Sandra Meer. "This stretch of the river is good for both beginners and seasoned paddlers, and it's a great location between St. Cloud and the metro area."

Business was slow in the beginning – their first full season was 2010 – but once the Meers found their niche and word started getting out, things started taking off.

Around 2012 stand up paddle boarding (SUP) became popular, giving *Clear Waters Outfitting* a couple years of great growth

before it leveled off. Then kayak fishing started getting big and gave the business another boost.

Each year the business hosts the BronzeBack Classic Fishing Tournament that brings in people from all over the upper Midwest. New and seasoned anglers are welcome.

"The upper Mississippi River is known nationally for world class smallmouth bass fishing," said Dan Meer.

Clear Waters Outfitting carries all kinds of paddling gear and equipment. They specialize in short and long day trips and offer paddle sport rental services, outfitting, shuttle services, overnight trips, paddle boarding, and kayak fishing. They also sell high quality, well-known brands of canoes, kayaks, SUP boards, and outdoor gear.

What makes the business so unique is how much they have to offer, including test paddling before purchase, and having experts on site who can offer help and advice to paddlers of any experience.

Their experts are certified by the ACA (American Canoe Association). They teach classes on location as well as work with area community education programs.

The past year during the pandemic was good for sales but not for river trips, largely because they were unable to offer shuttle services due to restrictions.

"We were able to maintain sales as a lot of them happened remotely and online, which kept us in business over the last year," said Dan Meer. "Demand has been high. We try to keep everything in stock and are constantly getting a new supply in."

Canoe and kayak repairs have also picked up.

"With the big boom and the cost of new increasing, a lot of people are starting to get their old ones fixed," he said. "The paddle sports industry as a whole has seen a boom. It's a hot topic right now as people can get outdoors and still social distance. People are cooped up and want to get out."







Clearwater Fire Dept. receives lightweight turnout gear

Clearwater firefighters are more mobile and more comfortable on scene after receiving new, lightweight turnout gear.

The department used CARES Act funds for the purchase, which included 25 sets of coats, pants, and boots. New helmets were also purchased.

Prior to receiving the new gear, firefighters had been wearing jumpsuits to medical calls where they didn't need as much protection, however they were hard to get into quickly.

The new coats and pants are constructed of the same protective outer shell but don't include all of the inside layers traditional fire-fighting turnout gear is made of. They're safe to wear in all situations with the exception of structural fires; during those calls the firefighters will wear their original heavyweight gear.

The new coats are longer for added protection, include all the reflective elements required, and are personalized on the backs with each firefighter's last name for easy identification. Along with allowing firefighters to be more mobile and less burdened down with weight, the coats and pants can be easily washed and dried, a task that is much more difficult with traditional turnout gear.

The newly purchased helmets are also an upgrade. The front of each is personalized with firefighters' names and they're colored coded;



firefighters wear a specific color depending on their rank in the department. Both of these features allow for quick identification during stressful situations where every minute counts.

As an added bonus, the new helmets' protective visors tuck up inside them, a money-saving feature over the old helmets, which flipped up over the top.


"These helmets cost more up front but will be cheaper in the long run," said Fire Chief Ryan Pridgeon. "The visors on the old helmets often get broken when they're flipped up, and they're expensive to replace."

Total cost of the new protective gear was \$33,000. The fire department used their \$30,000 of CARES Act funds for the purchase. The rest of the money was provided by Clearwater Twp., which donated the \$3,000 they had left over from their own CARES Act funds.

The *Clearwater Fire Dept.* is always looking for firefighters. Anyone who would like to apply is encouraged to stop by city hall to pick up an application.



More than a year into the pandemic, the "open" sign in countless online and retail storefronts has evolved into a universal symbol of the grit of small businesses. Tenacious entrepreneurs nationwide made a way to stay open in spite of all the obstacles.

As part of an effort to amplify these inspiring stories, Wells Fargo has commissioned three artists to design custom "open" signs for businesses that persevered and is also pointing entrepreneurs to resources that can help.

Dedicated to showcasing



women and diverse voices, illustrator and graphic designer Sophia Yeshi, is paired with Roxtography, a woman-owned business based near the Colville Reservation, outside of Seattle. Owner Roxanne Best shifted from in-person yoga and photography classes to outdoor stand-up paddleboarding classes and photography that embodies her love of nature.

Precision Productions. a new rental music studio, was just about to open its doors when the pandemic hit. Optimistic owner Kasey Phillips, who hails from Trinidad and Tobago, pivoted to a hybrid in-person and virtual studio model, never wavering from his plan to expand the music scene and own his first studio. Taking cues from music while paying homage to Phillips's Caribbean roots, Korean-born illustrator Deborah Lee, known for her use of bold, vivid colors, is interpreting how Precision Productions made a way to stay open.

"As an artist, it was rewarding to support not just a small business that stayed open in tough economic conditions, but one that's a platform for creativity," says Lee.

Writer, illustrator, visual artist and community organizer Gabriela Alemán has a passion for helping combat food insecurity. With her comics and pop art aesthetic, she's working to bring the mission of PREP Atlanta to life, which focuses on offering diverse food truck owners and caterers access to a commercial kitchen. During the pandemic, PREP Atlanta was a venue for keeping the city's restaurant and food industry afloat, including for many Black-owned businesses. Aleman will combine her art with a shared dedication to feeding the community as she depicts PREP Atlanta's grit.

This project comes on the heels of the July 2020 announcement of the Wells

Bob Arnold retires after 32 years of service to Clear Lake

When the Clear Lake City Council meets in January, 2021, it will be the first time in 32 years that Bob Arnold won't be there to make motions and participate in the decision-making process.

Since he first ran for election in 1988, Arnold has been a fixture in the City of Clear Lake and a popular, trusted member of the city council. He chose not to run for re-election this year, as he and his wife are moving out of the city and into a new home near the Territory Golf Course in St. Cloud which better suits their needs for the future.

No Axe To Grind

Arnold, well regarded as a humble public servant with great listening skills, didn't have a particular axe to grind when he first became involved. In fact, it was quite the opposite.

"When I ran for council in 1988, I wanted to be involved in what was going on in the city," recalls Arnold. "Also, my dad, Phil, was a previous mayor and council member and encouraged me as well. He actually passed me his books!"

Thus began his career in local government that has spanned parts of five decades, and has been defined by a tremendous amount of growth in the city he has lived in his entire life, except for a couple of years in the 1970's.

Being a part of that growth is something that Arnold is grateful to have been involved with because of his deep affection for the city itself. It's also what he considers the most enjoyable aspect of his service.

"In the past 30 years the city has doubled its population to over 600 people," says Arnold. "I've enjoyed being a part of the growth of the city that my family and I have called home for five generations."

Proud Accomplishments

Arnold lists several issues that over the years were the most important to the city and the surrounding communities.

Some of these include the joint Clear Lake-Clearwater sewage system, the Clear Lake Fire Dept. starting a substation serving the Palmer area, as well as the construction projects involving City Hall, Goenner Pavilion, the maintenance building and upgrading parks.

"While the council directed these efforts, it should be noted that the Lions and Lioness organizations helped to finance these improvements," adds Arnold

Perhaps the most important issue he worked on was the providing safe water for the residents.

"The city had such high nitrates in the water, it was necessary to find new sources for drinking water," remembers Arnold. "Two new wells have been dug since the original water tower was constructed in the late 70's."

Leadership

In addition to his successful work on city issues, Arnold has always been highly regarded by city staff members who find his style of governance to be truly collaborative. When staff talk about his leadership, it is easy to understand why he is such a popular figure in

the city.

"Over the years Bob has earned trust by being authentic, displaying empathy for the people of his community and listening to his constituents," says Clerk Kari Mechtel. "All of them, whether he agrees with them or not, and he has always accepted his public service as a privilege."

Former Clerk Marilyn Bujalski sees some of the same attributes that have led to Arnold's success.

"I had the pleasure of serving as city clerk and working with Bob as a city councilman for many years," says Bujalski. "Bob always made decisions based on what would be in the best interest of the residents of the City of Clear Lake."

While city staff think highly of Arnold, his colleagues on the council also heap praise on the man, as he has served as a living, walking encyclopedia of the history of the city, its people and the entire community.

"Experience and knowledge of past events in the city are important and we have been fortunate enough to have Bob contribute these assets the past 32 years," says former Mayor Bill Kiffmeyer.

Current Mayor Tim Goenner has an appreciation for Arnold's demeanor, as well as his dedication to the city.

"It has always been clear to me that Bob loved our city, he took his role as council member and acting mayor seriously, and he did what he believed was right," says Goenner.

Not Always a Bed of Roses

While Arnold says there were many positive aspects to being on council, there were some rough patches as well.

"Several times over the years it was necessary to do the unpopular task of raising taxes to pay for water and sewer improvements," says Arnold, who thinks that keeping an open mind and listening are two important factors to success

"Many of these improvements were necessary to meet the State of Minnesota standards for water and sewer. Some were in response to growth which is a sign of a healthy city."

As he moves on to another chapter in his life, Arnold demurs from speaking of his

legacy, but does hope that he has worked well with others and made the city a better place.

"I would like people to look back over the past 32 years and be able to say they had a council that was approachable, listened, and considered the needs of all," says Arnold.

That's probably exactly what his father would have said as well.
