## From the Editor



remember many years ago when I told a cousin (who lived in Bloomington) that I was in the process of building a house and moving to a new city called Big Lake.

## **Big Lake is booming in development!**

Big Lake has been seeing booming development in 2021 with several housing units going up, six new businesses arriving and four commercial/industrial operations completing projects.

"It's a fun time to be serving the City of Big Lake as we are experiencing quite a bit of development activity," said Community Development Director Hanna Klimmek.

#### Housing

As of mid-August, the city has issued 78 single-family building permits. The new, affordable Station Street Apartments will be completed in 2021 with 105 market rate rental units. The developer is Kuepers, Inc.

Sandhill Villas has received all the necessary approvals to develop 12 single-family homes in Big Lake. The developer is Jesse Hartung.

Wright's Crossing 3rd Addition received all necessary approvals to develop 31 single-family homes and

that addition is being developed and built by JP Brooks.

Norland Park's final plat #7 (last phase) received all necessary approvals to develop 18 single-family homes. Norland Park is being developed/built by Progressive Builders. Marketplace Crossing Phase I received all preliminary approvals to develop 60 affordable/market rate rental units. The developer is CommonBond Communities.

Everyone is encouraged to go to our webpage (www.biglake-chamber.com) and find reputable and reliable businesses and non-profits on our directory of members.





## Freedom Rock is a precious jewel of history

Adding to the natural and man-made beauty of Big Lake, Big Lake residents Karen Blake and Linda Paulson are seeing the fruits of their labor playing out in spectacular fashion at Lakeside Park.

Big Lake's Freedom Rock® is nearly complete and its dedication ceremony is set for Sept. 18 from 10 a.m. to noon. Artist Ray "Bubba" Sorenson has completed the artwork on the giant boulder and pavers are soon to be installed over the next several weeks.

The Big Lake Freedom Rock measures 10 ft. x 10 ft. and weighs more than 31 tons. It is a pink granite rock guarried out of Waite Park, Minnesota and was donated by Martin Marietta, Inc., transported to Big Lake's Lakeside Park by T.J. Potter Trucking, Becker and placed in the park by Landwehr Crane Service of St. Cloud one year ago.

"Hundreds of people have been involved in this project," said Karen Blake, "supporting Bubba's work as well as honoring their own beloved veteran by purchasing a paver. The Rock will tell Big Lake veteran veterans living and deceased."

By the middle of August, city staff were digging out around the rock in preparation for the paver bed. Donated granite and sand will arrive from Plaisted Companies on the 19th, and benches will be also be set up on the 19th with the help of volunteers, Elk River Nursery's Beau Eid and crew will do the actual placing of the pavers on Sat., Aug. 21.

After the painting on the rock was completed by Soreneson, the rock was sealed with a special sealant by Rob Swanson's professional painting company, Two Guys Painting. They used a special sprayer, applied three coats and donated their time and talent to the project.

"I was honored to do it," Rob said."It was a wonderful thing."

Sorenson's painting is decorated with a large American flag draping the boulder. On one side, he painted a Bald Eagle soaring through the sky with a Purple Heart medal in its talons. The Bald Eagle is a very common

sight flying over the Big Lake and Eagle

The Purple Heart is a medal awarded for wounds received in action against an enemy or as a direct result of an act of an enemy. This painting honors all purple heart recipients, not only in the Big Lake community but all across this great country.

On another side of the rock, Sorenson

painted a soldier dealing with PTSD. The picture depicts a soldier's hand over his face expressing the silent suffering experienced when a life-threatening event occurs, as seen in combat. The image recognizes that some wounds that our veterans struggle with are not always visible.

The ashes from a Big Lake combat veteran are painted into the uniform of this symbolic soldier picture.

A folded flag is also shown on the rock and it represents the veteran's burial flag. The flag drapes the veteran's casket, then after the service, it is folded and presented to the family to honor the memory of the veteran's military service to our country.

Sorenson also painted a local sailor, Arthur Embretson, one of 306 lost sailors on the USS Cyclops when it sank near the North Carolina coast. The ship, cargo and its crew have never been located or recovered. The sinking of the Cyclops remains the single largest loss of life aboard a United States naval ship that is not directly involved in combat.

A memorial stone in Orrock Cemetery marks the life and death of Embretson, the only resident of Orrock and Big Lake Twps to give his life in the service of the United States in WWI.

The Big Lake American Legion is one of the few legions formed as a memorial legion. The post is called the Arthur Embretson Memorial Legion Post 147.

Also painted on this side of the Freedom Rock is a portrait of Stella Huso, Big Lake's longest living Gold Star mother. The history of Gold Star families dates back to 1928, recognizing families who lost a member while in service to the USA.

Stella's son, Wayde was a Big Lake High School graduate who joined the Army in May of 1968. He lost his life through hostile action in Vietnam in August of 1969 and is honored on the Vietnam Memorial wall in Washington, D.C.

Stella is now 102 years old this year and her family remains in allegiance to the American military, dating back to action in the Civil War. Stella joined the Arthur Embretson American Legion Auxiliary Post 147 in 1978.

In honor of women who have and are serving in the U.S. military, Sorenson painted three local Big Lake women surrounding Rosie the Riveter, who was used to motivate, represent and unite women during the WWII war effort.

#### Sara Seck

Sara graduated from high school in 2011 and enlisted January 19, 2011 in the Army National Guard. She chose the Army because it was the branch where she could be a medic and not be confined to a hospital setting. She knew in the National Guard she could grow in the field of medicine in

civilian life as well as in the military.

Her training/schooling was at Fort Jackson, Fort Sam Houston, Fort Hood and Fort Irwin. She is currently deployed with the Task Force 1-194, and is a Sergeant in the Army with front line duties as a combat medic. She has been to Kuwait and Iraq. "Joining the military will always be one of the best decisions I have ever made. To be able to say that I wore one of the uniforms responsible for all of the blessings we have, is truly amazing."

Sara and her husband, who also served, moved to Big Lake in 2018 with their two dogs. They chose Big Lake because they love the small town atmosphere.

#### Dawn R. Perry

Big Lake resident, Dawn R. Perry joined the Women's Army Corp (WAC) in May 1975. She was in the first cycle of women to train at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. She was trained in multiple jobs (MOS's) and served in many states and Germany.

Dawn served in Desert Storm in 1991 and in combat for Operation Iraqi Freedom from December 2003 to March 2005. She retired from the Army in December 2005.

Dawn saw many changes in her 22 1/2 years of service - from being the only female in a battalion to being the first woman, who had served in combat to work at the Minneapolis VA hospital. She retired from there in 2019.

Dawn is proud of her military family, a father and four brothers who along with her, have a combined 100 years of military service to this country.

#### **Ione Brown**

Long time Big Lake resident Ione Brown was a WASP (Women's Airforce Service Pilot) during WWII. She was among the first American women trained to fly military aircraft. She belonged to a women's pilot organization, considered civil servants, so they were never fully incorporated into the armed forces.

Ione towed gliders out of Flynn Airport (corner of Hwy 25 and 200th street, also known as Airport Road to the locals) towing targets, testing planes and training pilots. The WASP's purpose was to free-up male pilots for combat roles.

In 1977, after the Air Force began training women to fly jets, congress passed legislation belatedly, giving the true pioneers, the WASPs, full military status.

Ione and her husband Bob had three children: Bob, Michael and Susan Brown-Hinrichs all graduates of Big Lake High School. Three of Ione's great grandchildren received their private pilot license by age 17. Two of them are attending University of North Dakota aeronautics program.

## Big Lake is 2nd Amendment Dedicated City

Earlier this year, the Big Lake City Council unanimously declared that Big Lake would be a 2nd-amendment dedicated city. The decision came after several individuals spoke during the open forum time of previous meetings asking the council to consider such a declaration. The resolution included four clauses, which are as follows:

- 1. The City Council hereby expresses its intent to uphold and protect the 2nd Amendment rights of the residents of Big Lake;
- 2. The City Council hereby declares Big Lake as a "2nd Amendment Dedicated City";
- 3. The City Council hereby declares its intent to oppose, through legal means, any

infringement on the right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms;

4. The City of Big Lake, City Council does hereby take full consideration of the Constitutional rights of City of Big Lake citizens to keep and bear arms when making decisions appropriating City of Big Lake resources.

Many Big Lake citizens supported this decision, including those forementioned who voiced their opinions at open forum. J. Brian Calva and Tim Underbakke both made comments on Facebook in support of the decision.

"Adopting any resolution to validate an existing constitutional right should not be controversial," said Calva. "It is simply restating a truth. Reasonable

## Supt. Truebenbach excited to be in Big Lake

Tim Truebenbach was hired as Big Lake's new superintendent last year during the height of the pandemic. Now, looking forward to a perhaps more normal school year, Truebenbach is excited to get to know the community he serves.

#### **Early Career**

Truebenbach was raised in Gaylord, Minnesota in a family of educators. His father was a teacher and coach, and his mother was a teacher's aid and recess supervisor.

"I idolized my dad," Truebenbach said.

Following his father's interests, Truebenbach played lots of sports while in school under his dad's coaching, and Truebenbach continued to follow his dad's footsteps after graduation. He attended St. John's Univ

uation. He attended St. John's University to pursue his elementary education degree.

His first job was as a paraprofessional in St. Cloud, followed by a position teaching fifth grade in Lakeville. Then he moved to

Meanwhile, Truebenbach decided to pursue further education. While he worked, he took classes at St. Mary's University to earn his Master's degree in the hopes of becoming a school principal. He was excited to accept an assistant principal position at Melrose High School when the opportunity opened up. Later, he became the principal for the Melrose Middle School.

"It was a brand new middle school, and so it was a great

opportunity," Truebenbach said.

After helping to get the middle school going, Truebenbach accepted a position as the principal at the Isanti Middle School. While he worked there, he also served as the Director of Teaching and Learning at the Minnesota Center. Truebenbach began working towards his doctorate and towards his superintendent's license. After gaining the license, he accepted a position as superintendent in Milaca.

#### **Coming to Big Lake**

When the position opened up in Big Lake, Truebenbach watched it eagerly.

"I'd been to the school a few times," Truebenbach said, describing how he would attend his daughters' swim meets at the school. "Even pulling up in the parking lot, you can tell it's a great school."

Truebenbach said he was especially moved when, washing his hands in the bathroom, he saw the school's symbol, the Hornet, on the soap dispenser. He got the impression that the students, staff, and community of Big Lake had a lot of school spirit.

Truebenbach said he saw a lot of potential for growth in Big Lake, as well. Enrollment (pre-pandemic) was going up, and the economy in the city was growing too.

"Enrollment drives what the school can offer," Truebenbach said.

Enrollment is linked to the amount of funding the school can receive from the state.

"I wanted to be a part of that," said Truebenbach, excited about the possibilities there are with a growing school and the opportunities to find new and better ways of bringing education to the students.

So when Truebenbach was offered the job as superintendent last year, he was thrilled to accept, even in the midst of the hectic COVID-19 crisis.

#### **Goals for the District**

Truebenbach's first and most important goal is finding the best way for the schools to navigate the pandemic. And after that, he wants to become more aggressive about finding and implementing excellent programs for his schools.

"I felt that, for the last couple years, education has had to play defense," Truebenbach said. "Now, I want to play offense."

Truebenbach is especially excited about Big Lake's apprenticeship programs, which gives teenage students the opportunity to learn real-life, career-oriented skills while still in high school. He has high hopes for the future of the program, and thinks that it will pair well with the new Big Lake Online program that was implemented last year, as it will give students to work during the school day and take classes online when they have time.

"They don't need to be limited by the school day," Truebenbach said.

Around mid-year, Truebenbach also hopes to implement a new strategic plan for the school, especially after the elections take place in November to fill the recently vacated school board position and to approve or disapprove the referendum.

Finally, Truebenbach says he is looking forward to meeting the community he is serving, as well. He enjoys interacting with the parents and students of the school district, and hopes to get to know everyone better. He says he's already gotten to make some friends with the swim parents as they pass his office on the way to the pool!

#### **Family**

Truebenbach takes a lot of pride in his family. He's been married to his wife, Elisa, for 23 years.

The couple has four kids. Lisa, the oldest, is a theater major and choreographer, who had the opportunity recently to perform in a production of Chicago.

Chloe, the next oldest, is currently a junior at Carlton University, and is excited to take a semester in Italy.


Henry, 18, is a freshman at St. John's University, Truebenbach's alma mater, and is studying communications.

people can disagree on whether to own a gun or not but resolving to agree with a constitutional fact is like saying, 'I agree we should be able to vote.' If you live in the United States it's simply how it is."

Underbakke agreed, stating, "When the Federal government actively supports a Constitutionally protected right's destruction, it is the moral duty of local government to ensure that right is preserved."

Not everyone was of the same opinion, as demonstrated by an individual going by the name Zaske JA on Facebook, who said, "Those who propose such 'sanctuary' laws/resolutions are building their case entirely on

a tightly held and inaccurate belief that common-sense gun safety laws such as universal background checks, high-capacity magazine bans, assault weapon bans, red flag laws are a violation of the rights guaranteed within the 2nd Amendment are unconstitutional. What is disturbing is these so-called "2nd Amendment sanctuaries" are merely a coordinated effort supported by politically motivated, national groups."

Other individuals hope that the county adopts a similar decision, as stated by several individuals who would like the county Sheriff to be involved in the situation.

"For the County Commissioners to ignore a

resolution and to discount this resolution wanted and relied upon by so many county voting residents, to uphold a US Constitutionally-backed right is highly concerning," said Jay Bob on Facebook. "Sherburne County Commissioners, please follow suit! Don't ignore this!"

Orrock Twp. also recently considered a similar resolution, although, since the township has no police force and relies upon the county sheriff to police the area, this adoption would have been symbolic in nature. However, the motion proposed by Board Member Gregg Felber did not receive a 2nd, and therefore failed.

This sense of safety, quality of life, and all around sense of being at home couldn't be made possible without the people of Big Lake coming forward to make it happen.
