

City Council consists of Mayor Tracy Bertram (term ends 2024), Council Member Rick Hendrickson (term ends 2022), Council Member Robin Dingmann (term ends 2022), Council Member Mike Doering (term ends 2024) and Council Member Becky Olmscheid (term ends 2024).

Council Members are elected to a four-year term. Mayoral elections are held every four years, while Council Members have a



staggered four-year term with two seats up for election every two years.

The Becker Fire Department consists of a parttime chief and 35 paid-on-call firefighters. They operate out of two fire stations, Station 1 located in the City of Becker and Station 2 located in Santiago.

They respond to both fire and medical emergencies with a call volume of approximately 525+ responses annually.

City of Becker frequently asked questions

Business Hours:

Building Permits:

The City of Becker processes building permits for both the City of Becker and Becker Township residents. Please visit the city's website for more information on the permitting process and for permit applications. http://www.ci.becker.mn.us/168/Building-Permits-Inspections

Compost Site:

The City of Becker has a compost site located at 12456 153rd Avenue. Leaves, grass clippings, yard debris, and branches (no tree stumps) can be brought to the site. Anyone wishing to access the compost site will need an electronic key card. Key-cards are available at City Hall during regular business hours. Residents of the City of Becker and Sherburne County are eligible to receive one free electronic key-card per household, replacement cards are \$5.00 each. Commercial users may no longer use the site due to rising costs.

Curfew:

Curfew in the City of Becker is as follows; 15 and under - 10:00pm each night, 16 & 17 - Midnight each night. Exceptions include and must be proven: school functions, church, employment, etc.

Dog Park / Dog Licenses:

In order to use the new dog park your dog must be licensed. Licenses may be obtained from Becker City Hall. Single Family Homes within city limits are allowed to have up to three dogs in their households. All dogs must be licensed when they reach six months of age and are eligible for rabies shots. License fees are \$10 per dog and are good for their lifetime; however, rabies certificates must be submitted when shots are updated. Please note, you will need to submit paperwork from your veterinarian showing the rabies expiration date when applying for the license.

Food Shelf Donations:

Staff at Becker City Hall can accept nonperishable items on behalf of the food shelf in limited amounts. Larger donations or perishable donations must be coordinated with the Food Shelf Director. For ways to donate monetarily please visit the city's website: http://www.ci.becker.mn.us/205/Food-Shelf. See the Area Clubs and Organization section for additional information on the Food Shelf.

New Residents:

Wondering who your utility providers are? The City has a great resource on their website for your use. Navigate to www.ci.becker.mn.us and click on the FAQs quick link on the left side of the webpage. Scroll to Utilities and Services for the important phone numbers you will need to set up services.

Notary Service:

Notary services are available at Becker City Hall free of charge during normal business hours. A current picture ID must be presented when seeking notary services. Please note, you must wait until you are in front of the notary before signing any documents. The decision to notarize a document is at the discretion of the notary—the notary may not be able to notarize your document(s) for various reasons.

Voting:

If you live in the City of Becker you vote at City Hall. For more information call 763-261-4302. Voter registration cards are available at the front desk at city hall or at the Sherburne County Gov't Center in Elk River.

Park Building Rentals:

Shelters are available for rent at City Park and Kolbinger Park. You can obtain information about the facilities and make reservations by contacting the Becker Community Center at 763-200-4271.

Utility Billing:

Water/Sewer bills are mailed out around the 5th of the month and are due on the 25th of each month. Payments may be mailed to City of Becker, PO Box 250, Becker, MN 55308, dropped off in one of the two boxes located at City Hall, processed automatically through our online payment system (PSN) or by submitting a direct payment form. Prior to moving in or out, contact City Hall at 763-200-4239 to make your new service or end of service request. Requests may also be emailed. See our website for more details: http://www.ci.becker.mn.us/181/Utilities.

Vehicle Unlocking:

If you have locked your keys in your vehicle, the Becker Police Dept. will attempt to unlock the vehicle provided that adequate proof has been shown regarding ownership of the vehicle and an indemnification of liability form has been completed. In the case the Dept. is unable to open the vehicle, you will be instructed to contact a locksmith or a tow company.

Watering Regulations:

In efforts to conserve water supplies, the City of Becker enforces odd/even watering restrictions annually from Memorial Day through Labor Day. If your address ends in an even number, you are allowed to water on the even days of the month and if your address ends in an odd number, you are allowed to water on the odd days of the month. In addition, watering is only allowed before 10 AM and after 6 PM. For exceptions to this rule see the City's website: http://www.ci.becker.mn.us/307/Lawn-Watering-Regulations.

Winter Parking Restrictions:

No vehicle shall park on any street or roadway between the hours of 12:01 am and 8:00 am from November 1st through April 15th, except for emergency vehicles.

Snow Removal Policy:

Every owner or occupant of each residence within the City of Becker is held accountable for clearing the full width of the sidewalk of snow and ice within 48 hours following the termination of any snow event or the formation of ice from any cause. If a new snow or ice event occurs, before the 48 hour window from the last event has expired, a new 48 hour timeframe starts. If the owner or occupant does not clear the sidewalk within 48 hours of a snow event, City staff will complete the work and the property owner will be charged a \$150 fee.

P. Golf Simulators Have Arrived!

Looking for some fun during the doldrum winter months?

Pebble Creek Golf Course has installed two golf simulators in an annexed room that not only feature golf courses — but also features football simulations, soccer simulations and even zombie attack simulations!

HD Golf, a company based out of Ontario, Canada produces what many in the business call the "best-in-class" golf simulators.

"While there are a number of good simulator companies, we chose HD Golf because of the realism in the golf experience," said Josh Kuha, general manager of the city's community center, golf course and parks.

"When you play on our simulators, you are looking at actual imagery that was taken at the course as opposed to computer generated graphics," Kuha continued. "HD Golf only adds a few golf courses each year because they actually go on the property

and 3D map the golf course to ensure that it plays identical to the real thing. This is a process that other simulator companies just don't do."

Pebble Creek's golf simulators give the players the chance to choose up to 37 golf courses from all around the world. On one simulator, guests can also choose to play football, soccer and bowling as well as mini-golf, TargetPro and angry golf.

"The replica firearms can be used to hunt various game or even test your 'double tap' skills against a pack of hungry zombies," said Kuha. "These simulators provide a lot of wonderful entertainment outside of just golf."

Kuha says either simulator can be equipped with a platform called LaserShot, which is the industry leader in Military and Police training.

"They use replica guns that have the exact weight, action and recoil of real firearms and can provide tactical and judgmental training that is difficult to mimic in a real life environment," he said. "This is something we will look into in the coming year as a collaboration with the Becker Police Dept."

Project 1 Construction out of Kimball was awarded the bid for the clubhouse expansion through a sealed-bid process. Kuha said that while Project 1 was the lowest bid, they also had a great reputation for quality and delivering on time.

"They did an amazing job on this project, especially considering that construction began at the end of the summer," said Kuha. "Once the structure was complete, the representative from HD Golf (Arden Sales Group) completed the installation of the simulators, flooring and technology."

The room was built out from the newly expanded bar/restaurant area and can be viewed by patrons of Pebble Creek, or the doors and roll-down windows can be closed to separate the two areas.

The city held a ribbon-cutting ceremony January 13 where Kuha held demonstrations of the simulators to all who attended. The following day, the simulators were opened to the public and the project was hailed a huge triumph.

"Opening weekend was a big success for the simulators at Pebble Creek," said Kuha. "Friday thru Sunday, 61 out of an available 78 hours of simulator time was booked. There was a ton of excitement at the clubhouse with most dining guests now sitting on the new side of the bar."

The dream of bringing a simulator to Pebble Creek was birthed many years ago but it didn't become a realizable objective until 2020 when the city encountered a unique opportunity to purchase two gently-used simulators from a fitness center at a substantial discount.

"What would have cost \$107,000 brand new, we were able to purchase for \$57,000," said Kuha. "Looking to capitalize on this cost saving opportunity; the first thing we looked at was if we could



All-Terrain Vehicles: Class 1 ATV (4-Wheeler) - Class 2 ATV (Side-by-Side) - Utility Task Vehicle

May be operated:

• On City Streets with a valid City of Becker registration; Registration form is located on City of Becker Police Website: www.ci.becker.mn.us or at the Becker Police Department Office; There is a \$25 fee for registration; Must visibly display the registration sticker to the rear o the vehicle, **cannot** be obstructed; On private property for the purpose of plowing, maintenance or other service work with permission; Class 2 ATV may be operated on the shoulder of a County Roadway (Sherburne County Code);Class 1 & 2 ATV may be operted on the shoulder of a Township Roadway; May be operted only between sunrise & sunset. Please consult the Becker City Code (www.ci.becker.mn.us) & MN DNR Regulations for further restrictions.

May not be operated:

accommodate simulators in our existing clubhouse. Unfortunately, due to the size and height requirements, we were unable to find a way to install them in any current space."

Because of this, Kuha and his team began working with architect Graeme Mahler (Mahler & Associates) on a design to expand the clubhouse.

"As with construction projects on older buildings, many times you run into opportunities to update the facility to better accommodate guests," Kuha said. "This was true with this project. Part of the cost of construction was to get our facility up to current standards in regards to ADA access."

With that, the south entrance and roadway was reclaimed and reconstructed to allow for better access for those with disabilities. Kuha says the final grade on these improvements will be completed in spring of 2022.

"Including the ADA components and some unforeseen construction expenses, the project will cost just under \$300,000," Kuha said. "It is being paid for by a combination of funding sources. The 2021 Capital Improvement Plan allocated \$95,000 toward the project and an additional \$21,000 was dedicated from proceeds from an Exclusive Beverage Contract with Viking Coca-Cola."

The remaining balance — surprisingly — is being paid for from the successful operation of Pebble Creek Golf Club.

"Pebble Creek turned a substantial profit in 2021 and this was a great opportunity to reinvest in something that will create additional revenue for many years to come," said Kuha.

For those interested in using the simulators for golf, football, soccer or any of the other offerings, the current booking period is 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. every day. Reservations can be made by visiting pebblecreekgolf.com.

Kuha says the golf simulators will also provide staff with the ability to conduct club-fitting and lessons using state-of-the-art technology.

"There are no better systems to measure the dynamics of the swing than a well-equipped simulator," he said. "Whether fixing a slice or comparing clubs for a purchase, the Sims at Pebble Creek has you covered."





Carl E. Johnson Park features the most recently updated play equipment within Becker's Park System. This important park serves a large residential area within the city and connects most closely with the developments on the other side of the Elk River. The new equipment provides a "unique" play experience with a zip-line, cyclone rope spinner and 18-foot-tall rope climbing structure. This park also includes full-court basketball and plenty of green space.

Becker City Park 10362 Co. Rd. 23

City Park is a community park and is the jewel of the Becker parks system. This 100-acre park has something for everyone. A brand new playground was added in 2010. Other amenities include a park building that is utilized year-round, a native planting area, several landscape gardens and natural pond areas, miles of hiking and horse trails, an 18-hole disc golf course, sledding hill and more.

A dog park was added in the lot next to the city park for furry friends. There are areas for large and small dogs to run off-leash and a designated parking area just north of the city park.

Kolbinger Park



13498 3rd St.

Kolbinger Park is another neighborhood park that recently underwent some very nice improvements. In early 2019, the building was updated with new paint, flooring and ceilings. This park features a full-size hockey rink and pleasure skating area. Ice skate rentals are available at the warming house for people looking try out this fun winter activity. They can be rented during staffed warming house hours posted on the Becker Community Center website. In the summer, Kolbinger Park is where residents will find a playground and the city's only skate park.

Pleasant Valley Park 12980 Carole Dr.

This is another neighborhood park. Pleasant Valley has a newer playground installed and will see updates to turf establishment and playground access trails in the coming years. This park also boasts a nice open green space area that is optimal for informal recreational activities and more.

Rivers Edge Park 14818 River St.


River's Edge Park is a neighborhood park that is nestled in a cozy corner of Becker. The pristine park underwent a turf establishment update in 2009 and remains a quaint and quiet retreat for residents.

Lion's Park at Snuffy's Landing 12812 115th Ave. SE.

Snuffy's Landing is a special use park on land leased from X-cel. This park boasts one of the most beautiful vistas of the Mississippi River in the region, as well as DNR boat landing, and several acres of natural surroundings.

Recently, the Becker Lions Club has been donating money to improve the park by adding a pavillion, a dock donated by the

DNR, a playground, and other ameinites. In honor of the club and all the good they do in the community, the park was renamed, "Lion's Park at Snuffy's Landing," keeping the historical name residents will recognize.

The Mississippi River is designated as a state water trail, and Snuffy's landing serves as an excellent access point to the river. Clear Waters Outfitting (Clearwater, MN) offers services to get residents on that trail and take out at Snuffy's Landing. (See ad for contact information.)

Trails

The City of Becker has more than thirty miles of trails and sidewalks throughout the city. The city continues to look for ways to improve trail connection throughout the entire city. In the past ten years the city has utilized statewide health improvement grant dollars to create an updated Trail and Sidewalk Plan, earned Safe Routes to School Dollars to create an updated

Safe Routes to School Plan, and in 2017, thanks in part to another successful grant award, installed a trail on Central Avenue from Rolling Ridge-to-117th Avenue that will literally bridge East & West across the Elk River.

Open Space

There are several open space areas in the north part of the city. City Park offers open space and a wide range of passive recreation opportunities such as picnicking, hiking, cross-country skiing, etc. The Sherburne County Oak Savanna and Pebble Creek Golf Course are public open space areas. The city also owns 80 acres of land north of the city and east of Co. Rd. 67.

Xcel Energy owns a large amount of open space land along the Mississippi River. Much of this land serves as buffer space and protection zones for their electrical generating plants. They allow some recreation use of their property by permit (such as bow hunting and hiking) in designated areas.

Park Planning

Beginning in 2018 was a comprehensive Park Systems Plan to determine the needs of the growing community as well as evaluate current offerings. This community-based project is facilitated by industry experts and will determine the strategic direction of our Parks & Recreation department based on the feedback from the community and other stakeholders. This is an exciting opportunity to learn what residents are looking for to improve quality of life.

The City of Becker is well served, not only by the aforementioned parks system, but also by way of a wide range of recreation facilities such as the Becker Community Center, Kolbinger Park Building, City Park Building and 18-hole Disc Golf Course and the 30 acre Becker Athletic Complex. With the parks and facilities as a base, Becker has an excellent range of recreation offerings.

BCC is to provide the community with quality-oriented leisure time opportunities in a safe environment. These activities may take many forms, such as informal recreation, aquatics, group fitness, and special events. Additionally, it is hoped that those individuals utilizing the BCC and its programs will gain a full appreciation of both the physical and social value of active recreation and participation.

Freedom Days And Community Events

The City of Becker has a long history of holding formal community-wide gatherings, including the Memorial Day Auto Economy Run in May of 1953, Strawberry Festival from 1966-1971, Becker Bicentennial Celebration in 1976, Becker Pioneer Days in 1979 & 1980, Octoberfest in 1987 and 1988, and Becker Freedom Days from 1988 to the present. She grew up in a small Minnesota town with her parents and two older brothers, graduating in 1993 as the class Valedictorian. She moved to Becker in 2005 and began working at CentraCare, providing care for patients of all ages as a board certified family medicine and sports medicine physician.

For the past 13 years, she has also held the role of physician leader for five of CentraCare's family medicine clinic sites. She is also a devoted mother and wife, as well as a prolific community

volunteer. For the past two years she has worked on the front lines of the COVID pandemic, providing the community with compassionate care and a local, trusted voice. For these reasons and more, we are proud to announce Dr. Becky Mueller, D.O., as the Patriot's 2022 Becker Area Citizen of the Year.

"It was a shock to be notified of the honor and I feel undeserving as I look around our community at the other amazing people who live here and make Becker a great place to live and work," Dr. Mueller says. "I am truly honored to be recognized as an individual, but I wish to also extend this honor to all healthcare and other frontline workers for their perseverance during these unprecedented times."

Early Life

Life in a small town is familiar to Dr. Mueller, as she lived with her family in Buffalo Lake, where volleyball and basketball were her sports of choice. However, her interests went beyond athletics, as she was also active in band and choir, as well as 4-H, her church's youth group and many other volunteer activities.

"I grew up thinking I was going to be a teacher like my mom, but I also really enjoyed science in high school and my thoughts turned initially to pursing a career in physical

therapy," she says.

After high school, she enrolled at Hamline University and pursued a double major in Biology and Exercise/Sport Science before her education pathway turned to pre-med. After working with all of the Piper athletic teams over her four years, her travels brought her to Des Moines University, where she took the national certifying exam to be a certified athletic trainer during her first year of medical school. She stayed in Iowa at Trinity Medical Center in Davenport for her family medicine residency before moving to Michigan State for her sport medicine fellowship. From there, she moved back to Minnesota and several months later was hired to be a physician at CentraCare Clinic in Becker.

First Impressions

"I knew from the day that I came to Becker to interview for my job that this was the right place for me," Dr. Mueller says. "I just felt at home."

It didn't take her long to get involved in the community, as she immediately starting volunteering as the team doctor for the Becker Bulldog football program, which won a state title in her first year with the team. She continues to work with the team to this day, as well as teams at SCSU.

"Practicing family medicine in Becker

is awesome . . . and to care for patients across the ages from newborns to their grandparents and even great grandparents is awesome, too," Dr. Mueller says. "It still amazes me after 15 years here when I just figure out 'new' family connections that I wasn't aware of...or just hadn't been smart enough to put together yet!"

An affable person, Dr. Mueller has become part of the fabric that makes small town living appealing to so many people. To her patients, she's often times known as "Dr. Becky" and she goes to great lengths to get to know the story behind the people she treats.

"The care in this community goes both ways a lot of my long-time patients take great interest in starting or concluding their visits by asking about my children or other personal points of connection we may have," Dr. Mueller says.

Family Matters

While she is extremely busy at work and with her many other commitments, nothing is more important to her than her family.

Married to husband Dave since 2013, she is committed to being a great mom to 21 year old step-daughter Sam, a nursing major at NDSU, as well as six year old Ben, five year old twins Ty and Jack and two year old Emma.


"I now also have first hand experience of the quality of the school system by having my oldest son in school, which is something I heard about prior to moving here," she says. "I can't extend enough gratitude for the daycare providers and teachers and staff at the school who have also been on the front line caring for my kids while both Dave and I have worked long hours each day through this pandemic, both as front line workers."

Leadership

Her volunteerism extends into the schools, where she has been a member of the HS Site-based team since 2011, while also serving on curriculum committees in the past. She's also been a Safety Camp lecturer, concussion educator and has worked on many other health initiatives from Project BrainSafe to several medical work groups - that are focused on helping people live better lives.

"I try to meet people where they are at . . . I want to be there to support them through the years and help to guide them and their health," Dr. Mueller says. "I can be a patient's biggest cheerleader if they are needing that extra motivation to accomplish their health care goals, but for those who aren't yet in the right mindset to make changes, I make sure they know that



Kolbinger and members of the fire department also visited the neighborhoods in their big red rigs and ladder trucks. Becker Mayor Tracy Bertram, and many council members and staff also attend along with State Senator Andrew Mathews and State Rep. Shane Mekeland.

and rescue vehicle for kids to check out.


Sherburne Co. Sheriff Joel Brott also makes many stops to introduce himself. He ordinarily provides attendees informational handouts and speaks about calls for service in the previous year and the new laws that have gone into effect.

Brott also encourages everyone to call about any suspicious activity they notice, and to use 911 if they don't know the sheriff department's phone number.

Santiago Twp. also regularly hosts a Night to Unite event with pulled pork sandwiches and door prizes for attendees, both supplied by the Santiago Lions.

"As you know, the Night to Unite event is held for the purpose of getting neighbors to get to know each other," said Chief Baloun in an earlier interview. "Knowing each other benefits the safety of the neighborhood and ultimately our community with people being more involved. When we know our neighbors, we can

better recognize and watch for things in our neighborhoods that stand out, are out of place, or don't belong. When this happens or is recognized people address the issues, which could be calling 911 and involving law enforcement."

Baloun says his police department really enjoys the event as a way to further connect with the community.

"When people get to know their police department, people develop more trust and less apprehensiveness about contacting law enforcement," he said. "We appreciate the opportunity to speak with folks in a non-intrusive and less formal atmosphere."

He added that going into neighborhoods gives the police department an opportunity to speak with people they may not otherwise have an opportunity to speak to, which benefits everyone.

"It's all about strengthening the safety of our community and events such as Night to Unite help us work toward that," said Baloun. "We especially appreciate the support demonstrated toward law enforcement and public safety. I couldn't be more pleased with the response we received at each party; it was great!"

I am ready to help when they are ready."

Those same beliefs have served her well in her leadership roles at CentraCare, even in the early days of the pandemic.

Dr. Becky says that she knew the people in the community would need a local place they could visit to seek care when they were ill. "I helped to lead the quick change of CentraCare Becker to an acute respiratory clinic to mimic the model being rolled out in St. Cloud and across the country," she says. "For the first three months of the pandemic, I along with two other providers cared for only ill, COVID positive or COVID suspect patients, who were well enough to still be managed on an outpatient basis. This was early in the pandemic when so much about this virus was still unknown, and I had staff and providers who were leery about what working in this setting would mean for their own health and that of their families."

Through her leadership and the dedication of the staff, the call to serve was answered and they were able to do so in a safe manner. "It was time to lead by doing and I was right there with them the whole time . . . I am so proud of the team that pulled together to ensure sick patients in this area could keep their care local," she says. "I am so proud that the clinic staff did not have anyone develop COVID-19 from a work exposure."

Connections

Another success has been the patient-doctor relationships that have allowed for conversations as to what to believe in a world where there is so much disinformation.

"I thank the patients who have come to me during the pandemic to ask questions about the COVID-19 disease or immunization,

"It is incredibly frustrating to still hear people who think COVID-19 is a hoax, the misinformation that is out there about the disease and the vaccine, and how political this pandemic has been."


Despite the challenges, she has kept a positive attitude and is now able to reflect a bit on the successes of the past two years, even with the threat of burnout faced by many health care staff.

"We push through because of our commitment to our patients and the love of the job that we all chose for our own individual reasons, but burnout is real for all layers of the care team nowadays more than ever," Dr. Mueller says. "The fear for the continued good health of our own families, who we come home to after caring for sick people day in and day out, is real."


However, Dr. Mueller finds strength in her family, as well as the many co-workers who have bonded together to provide compassion and care to the entire community.

We are so grateful for your prayers, support, and encouragement during this challenging time. Thank you for entrusting your loved one's care to us. We take that privilege very seriously.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) have released guidance allowing visitation in the nursing home and assisted living settings without an appointment regardless of a facility's COVID status.

This means indoor, outdoor, and off-site visitation is now available without an appointment. Visitor screening, masking (using a well-fitting, facility-provided medical grade mask), and all other infection control practices remain the same. Visitation is allowed in resident rooms and apartments but may not occur in common areas of the buildings.

Vaccinated residents/clients with vaccinated visitors may visit without masks and without social distancing during the visit inside the apartment or suite. However, due to the high transmission rate in our county and the virility of the new variants, we strongly encourage wearing masks.

Vaccinated resident/clients with unvaccinated visitors will still need to mask and socially distance during the visit.

Unvaccinated residents/ clients with all visitors will still need to mask and socially distance during the visit.

We continue to encourage all visitors to get vaccinated and to practice safety measures while out in the community. The CDC has released some suggestions on how to be safer in the community. Some of those include wearing a well-fitting mask in indoor public settings, avoiding crowded and poorly ventilated areas, and staying home and getting tested if you feel sick or have any COVID symptoms.

We continue to test staff and residents/clients according to current guidance.

(GSA) - 3 tenants, 2 clients, 17 staff, and 0 deaths; Good Shepherd Assisted Living (Shepherd Court) – 7 tenants, 2 clients, 16 staff, and 3 deaths offsite; Shepherd Oak **Apartments** – 3 tenants, 1 client, 18 staff, and 0 deaths; **Shepherd** Oak West Apartments – 3 tenant, 2 client, 13 staff, and 1 death; Home Health Care - 0 clients, 4 staff, and 0 deaths; **Shepherd of Grace** – 3 tenants, 4 clients, 20 staff, and 1 client death.


The Lions work with the Becker Boy Scouts to clean up







INDUSTRIAL PARK STAYS COMPETITIVE WITH PLANNED SHERCO DECOMMISSIONING

(Editor's Note: The following article was submitted by Becker City.)

The City of Becker is seeing continued increased interest in Industrial development within the Becker Business Park. TJ Potter Trucking is currently underway with a 90,000 sq ft expansion on their new warehouse. Hubbard Electric recently completed their new facility, along with Thousand Hills' building expansion. The remaining available properties within the Business Park are competitive, as the city attempts to attract new businesses, due to the infrastructure in the area, high quality of life, and the area workforce. The properties have ample power due to the vast

Xcel Energy infrastructure, mainline rail access with BNSF, recreational and industrial opportunities with the Mississippi

River, and great access to the St. Cloud and St. Paul/Minneapolis metropolitan areas.

Xcel Energy's Sherco coal-fired plant is scheduled to decommission Unit 2 in 2023 and Unit 1 in 2026. As of January 2022, The Minnesota Public Utility Commission (PUC) is underway with reviewing the company's resource planning document. This document identifies how the company plans to generate the needed electricity to sell to its customers. The company's current proposal includes decommissioning of the last coal-fired unit at Sherco and construction of additional solar and other renewable energy sources. There is a request from Xcel Energy to the PUC to build approximately 3,480 acres of solar adjacent to the Sherco plant. Final decisions on the resource planning and solar development are expected mid-2022.

With the changes in the utility industry and impacts at the Sherco plant, Xcel Energy and the City are coordinating and partnering on economic development efforts to attract new businesses and assist in the expansion of existing businesses within the Becker Business Park. These efforts have been successful in recent years with the construction of Northern Metal Recycling and the expansion of Stalt Trucking

sion of Stolt Trucking.

The City is continuing its reinvestment efforts within the commercial and residential areas of the community. Multiple street projects are planned for 2022 and the coming years. The City is also working on creating marketable commercial lots in the "T-Town" district for additional business growth opportunities.


